## Parents and Children Say No to Drugs Together

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Recently, the problem of new drugs invading the schoolyards has become increasingly serious. The drug problem is one of the main issues faced by the government. Drugs cause great harm to the people's health in the country, and the subsequent social and school security problems have posed daunting challenges to the overall development of the country. In the process of playing, when they completed each task, they were rewarded a surprise gift. Accompanied by their parents, they together created beautiful family memories, which would enhance their parent-child relationships. The parents and children who participated on that day responded enthusiastically to the activity. The total number of participants at the event exceeded 8,000, and thousands of parents and children spend the most beautiful and extremely educational weekend.
